Council Highlights

Notes from each of last month's Council Meetings. Full minutes are available at the County Office.

May 9th Regular Council Meeting

Council had a delegation from Warren Pickard, President of Wild Rose, regarding the potential of offering high speed internet in Clear Hills County with future telephone service options.

Administration to prepare a Bylaw to establish fire ban regulations and immediately send out a notice that if ratepayers plan to burn they have to contact the County office 24 hours prior.

Council received reports from the department heads and Chief Administrative Officer.

Council ratified requisition no.'s 1328, 1329, 1339, 1340, 1341 and 1342 and approved requisition no.'s 1343, 1344, 1345, 1346, 1347, 1348 and 1349.

Council ratified the expenditures for Clear Hills County for the period of Apr. 26th to May 9th for a total of \$206,012.20.

Council will proceed with day labour for water and sewer extensions to three areas of new development in Worsley using EXH for the engineering.

Council created an ad hoc committee of Reeve Allen, Councillor Nykolyshyn, Councillor Radzick and Allan Rowe, Public Works Superintendent, to look at taking over a portion of the Canfor Road.

Council amended Bylaw No. 8 - Schedule of Fees as was presented and directed Administration to bring back proposed amendments for industry approval fees.

Council passed Bylaw 88-06 for the purpose of establishing an Agricultural Service Board.

Council directed the Public Works Superintendent, after consultation with Alberta Environment and the North Peace Regional Landfill Commission, to bring back a proposal for a combination of bins types (small and large) for the Regional Transfer Stations.

Councillors and Administration are to bring back options regarding electoral boundaries to the July 25th Council meeting.

Council scheduled a Special Council Meeting for May 16th.

Council received a County logo and/or road sign submission.

Council received an update on brushing on the Clear Hills Connector Road Phase I.

Council awarded the proposal for regrade on 730 Degazetted, from East of Worsley School to the first speed corner, to low bidder Moffatt Construction in the amount of \$998,000.00, subject to review by Administration and EXH Engineers.

Council rejected all tenders for the Shewchuk Pit gravel crushing and will negotiate and bring back options for gravel crushing at the Shewchuk Pit and in the interim purchase gravel from local suppliers.

Council denied the request for an approach on the NW 13-84-05 W6M as per the original developer's agreement.

Council will proceed to amend the Municipal Development Plan with regards to Confined Feeding Operations.

Council approved Policy 3203 - Approach Construction, as amended.

Council received a delegation from Peter Frixel regarding ideas for economic development.

Council received information on 2005 mowing costs.

Administration is to research the liability of allowing salvaging at the landfills and bring a recommendation to a future Council Meeting.

Council rescind Resolution C1075(12/13/05) and C925(10/25/05) and that no action be taken at this time with regard to access to the SE 20-86-6-W6M.

Council received an update on the Alberta Heritage Tree Project.

Council received an update on funding for regional water systems from the Alberta Waste Water and Water Program.

Council authorized administration to purchase one Degelman offset hitch unit for use on the roadside mowing program.

Council denied the additions to the Master Road Use Agreement made by Adamant Energy Inc.

Council will offer the Worsley Historical Society to take over the R.V. Park in Worsley as part of the land contribution (approx. 10 acres total).

Council informed the Hines Creek Golf Course that the County will *consider* including paving of Township Road 833 from Highway 64 to the Golf Course entrance road and portion of the parking lot along with any future plans for paving in the area.

Council sent a letter to the Cherry Canyon Agricultural & Recreational Society recommending the intersection at the current four way stop on Secondary Highway 717 be left as is.

Administration will forward agenda items as brought forward to the Regional Reeves and Chief Administrative Officer's Meeting and Zone Meeting.

Council will proceed with an engineering proposal (by EXH Engineers) for the repair of Bridge File 78616 & 78173.

Council purchased one block in the Menno Simons Library community calendar for \$50 plus an additional \$15 for the new logo and will request they include the Council and Agricultural Service Board meeting dates.

May 16th Special Council Meeting

Council proceed no further (moratorium) with Intensive Livestock (Hogs) until the Municipal Development Plan has been amended through the public process.

Administration to bring back the Municipal Development Plan for review at the May 23rd Regular Meeting.

Council supports the opportunity for a beef slaughter plant in Alberta.

Council received an update regarding staff.

Council accepted information regarding contract negotiations.

Council Highlights continued

May 23rd Regular Council Meeting

Council ratified requisition no.'s 1350, 1351, 1354, 1355, 1356, 1357, 1358, 1359, 1360, 1361, 1362, 1363, 1364 and 1365.

Council received reports from the department heads and Chief Administrative Officer.

Council will fund registration and motel rooms for up to 10 individuals to attend the Manure Management workshop being held in Red Deer on June 26th - 28th & provide the County van for transportation.

Council ratified expenditures for Clear Hills County for the period of May 10th to May 23rd for a total of \$255,985.19.

Administration to bring back options for use of additional funds for libraries at Hines Creek, Worsley, Cleardale and Bear Canyon.

Council reviewed and amended the Grader Report Card.

Administration to bring back an amended Municipal Development Plan for first reading at the June 13th Regular Council Meeting and proceed with it from there.

Council will send a copy of the draft Municipal Development Plan to legal counsel for review.

Council authorized final payment of \$5,000.00 to the Sirolli Business Centre for service from January - June, 2006.

Council will request written confirmation from the Peace River School Division that students within a certain distance from the Worsley School will not be charged extra for bus fees if/when a walking path is built.

Council will enter into a Design and Budget Preparation Agreement with Wild Rose Networks to prepare the design and budget for wireless high speed internet throughout the County at a cost of \$15,000.00 +GST with half of that amount to be paid upon signing of the agreement and Council will negotiate with the Village of Hines Creek to apply for 2006 Municipal Sponsorship Grant funding for a wireless high speed internet network within the County and Village.

Council amended the Cemetery Grant Policy (1208) to include a maximum grant amount of \$500 per year.

Council authorized a \$500 grant to all requesting Cemeteries within the County under the 2006 Cemetery Grant program.

Council agreed to purchase the 2006 Elgin Road Wizard Sterling SC Stock street sweeper for a total amount of \$205,994 plus GST (cost of approximately \$70,000 to the County) as per the Village of Hines Creek recommendation.

Council received a delegation from Veronica Bliska and Ron Longtin with Mackenzie Municipal Services Agency (MMSA) regarding membership in MMSA and upcoming renewal of contracts.

Council received a delegation from Beccy Montpellier and Terry Wayland regarding the potential Hog Factories coming into the County and Municipal Development Plan amendments.

Council received a delegation from Don Thomas regarding his water well and the hog barns.

Council will provide approximately \$1,200.00 to the Lobby Group for bus transportation to Edmonton on May 17th to lobby for permanent removal of hog factories from Clear Hills County.

Council authorized the following funds under the 2006 Capital Grant

Program:

\$7,500 to the Carters Camp Recreational Society for the Campground upgrades project;

\$10,750 to the Burnt River Recreation Board for the lawn mower;

\$50,000 to the Worsley Agricultural Society for the Arena Renovation project;

\$15,000 to the Hines Creek Golf and Country Club for the Workshop project;

\$5,000 to the David Thompson Hall Society for the Furnace Replacement;

\$5,000 to the Village of Hines Creek for the Hines Creek Fitness Center;

\$25,000 to the Village of Hines Creek for the Dave Shaw Arena Upgrade project;

and denied grants to the following:

Worsley Historical & Cultural Association for the Brettle Barn;

an additional grant to the Village of Hines Creek for the Hines Creek Playground project.

Council discussed local and surrounding forestry issues.

Council changed the potential hog barn locations map to read Jake & Sandra Klassen instead of Mike Radzick.

Council received a delegation from Jim Stephenson, Woodlands Manager at Canfor, regarding contributions towards local campgrounds and the Clear Hills Connector Road Agreement.

Council will send the Honorable Minister Ty Lund a thank you letter for the 2006 Infrastructure and Transportation funding.

Administration is to forward agenda items for the Northwest Alberta Mayors and Reeves Meeting on June 9th.

Council awarded the following tenders:

Water and waste water services in the Hamlet of Cleardale to low bidder Glen Armstrong Construction Ltd. in the amount of \$1,059,876.73 (incl. G.S.T.), as per EXH Engineers recommendation.

Regrade on Township Road 830 to low bidder Amarillo Contractors Ltd. in the amount of \$769,809.55 (incl. G.S.T.), as per EXH Engineers recommendation.

Regrade and new construction on David Thompson Road (Range Road 34) to low bidder Amarillo Contractors Ltd. in the amount of \$293,716.80 (incl. G.S.T.), as per EXH Engineers recommendation.

Dodge ½ ton 4X4 Quad Cab to Campbell Chrysler in the amount of \$33,806.

Council will begin recruitment for a Chief Administrative Officer.

Council will schedule a Council retreat in June.

Council received an update regarding staff and contractors.

Primary & Secondary Highways

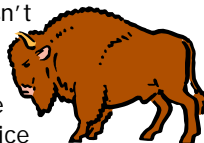

NEW HORIZONS FOR SENIORS PROGRAM CALL FOR APPLICATIONS 2006 FOR ALBERTA

The program's objectives are to:

encourage seniors to contribute their skills, experience and wisdom in support of social well-being in their communities; and promote the ongoing involvement of seniors in their communities to reduce their risk of social isolation.

Projects funded by the New Horizons for Seniors Program will lead to vibrant and inclusive communities that benefit from the increased participation of seniors in community life. Projects will contribute to this goal by directly involving seniors as project leaders, promoting partnerships and volunteerism, responding to local community needs, and strengthening seniors social networks. Projects should also demonstrate good value for money and have a plan for measuring results.

Applications must meet the eligibility criteria of the program in order to be considered for funding. As part of these eligibility criteria, projects must meet one of the program objectives and respond to at least one of the funding priorities in Alberta. Eligible applications will then be assessed in order to determine their relative merit. The number of projects selected will be based upon the availability of funds and the overall quality of the applications received. For each Call for Applications, funding priorities are set to ensure that the unique needs of seniors and communities in different regions are recognized and supported. In Alberta, priorities have been set in consultation with the *New Horizons for Seniors Review Committee for Alberta*.

The New Horizons for Seniors Program invites eligible organizations to submit applications for funding under the latest call for applications.
