

BYLAW NO. 11

A BYLAW OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CLEAR HILLS NO. 21, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CLEAR HILLS NO. 21 AND OTHER MUNICIPALITIES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTER-MUNICIPAL SERVICE AGENCY TO BE KNOWN AS THE MACKENZIE MUNICIPAL SERVICES AGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Government Act allows a municipality to enter into an agreement with other municipalities for the performance of any matter or thing judged to be of benefit to them; and


WHEREAS, the Municipal Government Act allows for the establishment of an inter-municipal service agency; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal District of Clear Hills No. 21 considers it beneficial to enter into an agreement with certain other municipalities for the provision of planning, subdivision and regional/community economic development services.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Municipal District of Clear Hills No. 21, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

01. THAT the agreements for the provision of services through the establishment of an inter-municipal service agency to be known as the Mackenzie Municipal Services Agency, copies of which are attached hereto, are hereby ratified and approved; and the Reeve and the Secretary Treasurer are hereby authorized to execute the said agreements for and on behalf of the Municipal District of Clear Hills No. 21.
02. THAT this bylaw shall come into full force and effect upon third and final reading.




