

BYLAW NO. 111-08

A BYLAW OF CLEAR HILLS COUNTY, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUTHORIZING AND FIXING THE MILL RATES LEVIED AND IMPOSED AGAINST ASSESSABLE PROPERTY FOR THE TAXATION YEAR 2008.

WHEREAS, Clear Hills County (hereinafter referred to as "the County") has prepared and adopted detailed estimates of the probable expenditures of the County as required by Part 8 of the Municipal Government Act, Chapter M-26, revised 2000, and amendments thereto; and

WHEREAS, Part 10 of the Municipal Government Act requires a Council in each year to authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to levy on the assessed value of all assessed property a tax sufficient to meet the amount of the expenditures as are estimated by the Council; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Government Act authorizes a Council to classify assessed property as residential property, non-residential property and farm land property and to establish different rates of taxation in respect to each class of property, subject to the restrictions specified in the said Part 9 of the Municipal Government Act; and

WHEREAS, the amounts required to be raised by the County through the property tax levy for the various purposes specified in the Municipal Government Act against the various classes of property as herein specified are as follows:

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of Clear Hills County, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

1. The Chief Administrative Officer for the County is hereby authorized and directed to levy on the assessed value of all assessed property shown on the Assessment Roll of the COUNTY the rates set forth by this bylaw.
2. For the year 2008 there shall be levied against all property the following rates to produce the required sums to meet the County's general Municipal expenses.
