Putting poor crops to alternate use

Several areas in Alberta have experienced limited precipitation this growing season. As a result, some producers are considering putting their crops to alternate uses rather than waiting for them to mature and mechanically harvesting them.

Agriculture Financial Services (AFSC) clients with production insurance can choose to use their insured crop for alternate use including pasturing, ploughing down, spraying out, silaging or harvesting the crop into an immeasurable state. Clients can use the AFSC yield estimation calculator to help determine potential yields and make decisions on when to harvest or preharvest a crop. The [yield estimation calculator](#) (opens in a new link) is easy to use, and producers can have an estimated yield in a few simple steps.

At least five days in advance of putting an insured crop to an alternate use, clients need to contact AFSC and arrange for a yield appraisal and the release of the insured acres. Putting an insured crop to an alternate use before the acres are released by AFSC may impact the adjusted production in determining potential claims and future coverage.

When contacting AFSC, clients will need to provide the number of acres intended to be put to an alternate use and an estimate of the yield. Depending on the estimate of yield, the acres may be released from an AFSC branch office, or an adjuster may complete a field inspection to determine the yield appraisal before acres are released.

Clients wanting to put an insured crop to an alternate use before the acres are released can leave standing inspection strips or exclosures with prior approval by AFSC. Annual crops may be left in the swath as well to allow AFSC to conduct a yield appraisal.

Clients should review the information on Inspection Strips to ensure they understand what is required and avoid any potential negative impacts to their insurance.

Low yield allowance change encourages poor crops be used as feed

AFSC is adjusting the low yield allowance for 2023 to encourage farmers to put more poor-quality crops towards livestock feed in dry areas.

For 2023, Agriculture Financial Services (AFSC) is doubling the low yield threshold to allow for additional cereal or pulse crops to be salvaged for livestock feed. For example, the barley crop threshold will be increased from 150 to 300 kg per acre. The low yield allowance is a standard part of production insurance and is meant for situations where there may not be value in harvesting for grain (e.g., low yield due to extreme heat and severe drought).

This adjustment enables producers to act swiftly to salvage crops for livestock feed rather than watch their fields deteriorate further, and risk harvesting nothing. Clients can use the AFSC yield estimation calculator to help determine potential yields and make decisions on when to harvest or preharvest a crop. The [yield estimation calculator](#) (opens in a new link) is easy to use, and producers can have an estimated yield in a few simple steps.

Clear Hills County transfer stations are no longer accepting used chemical jugs.

Fairview North Peace Regional Landfill (NPRL) will be accepting used chemical UNTIL December 31, 2023.

As of January 1, 2024 all used chemicals jugs will have to be returned to participating retailers.

Across Canada, farmers return used ag items like jugs to ag-retailers. This streamlines the process and brings it into alignment with other provinces. It simplifies the program since your ag retailer may already be accepting Cleanfarms materials and it makes it easier for your municipality since they won't need to look after extra items. Most of all, when you're thinking about which materials you want to bundle up to recycle, you know they're all going to the same place: your local ag retailer.

How does this work for growers?

1. Rinse & remove

- Use chemical handler/ triple rinse/ pressure rinse
- Remove paper booklets, and discard

2. Fill bag & close

- Place rinsed containers in bag and securely close
- Only one material type per bag (i.e., jugs)

3. Seed treatment containers

- Caps are to remain securely ON

- Place in a separate collection bag (note - this is preferred for collection at municipal sites and required at retail sites and it make it easier for storage and transportation)

4. Return for recycling. Check with your retailer to see when you can begin returning to retail

For 2022: Please ask your local retailer if they have begun accepting jugs as many are participating in the program before municipal sites are phasing out. 2023 is the year where Manitoba and Alberta farmers will see the most change and we'll announce it with ads in local newspapers, on radio, social media and with posters at your ag retailer. Also, municipal sites that are no longer receiving materials will post signs long before they close.

Do you have livestock?

Are you aware of the VSI (Veterinarian Services Incorporated) Program?

- * Aids in the development of livestock expansion with a long term goal of the producer and veterinarian services sustainability.
- * The VSI program supplies a cost-share support to livestock producers, whereby Clear Hills County covers 50% of the cost eligible veterinary procedures.
- * Membership is \$52.50 for a five year term.

Do you know the County has a BSE Testing Incentive Program?

The BSE testing program is to encourage producers to participate in BST Testing and assist in realizing the target of 30,000 beef cattle annually being tested to keep Canada's status as a controlled BSE risk country.

Eligibility: must be a VSI member and resident/landowner in Clear Hills County with livestock.

Restrictions: Only Veterinarian Clinics (and livestock owners) will have access to the BSE test results.

Process: VSI services provides the County with a list of members that had beef cattle tested in the quarterly report. The County then pays the member. The 2022/2023 incentive is \$125/animal.




