



Baby birds learn to sing during spring. Although they are born with the ability to sing, they must learn the specific songs of their species. They often learn their songs within two months of being born.




Spring is all about new beginnings and transformations – think of it as a season that symbolizes starting fresh and starting over.



Do you need a Development Permit?

Development Permits are required in Clear Hills County pursuant to the Clear Hills County Land Use Bylaw. A Development Permit ensures that the proposed use of the land does not conflict with surrounding uses and that the proposed development is set back the appropriate distances from the property lines and roadways, located in a safe location (not too close to water bodies or oil and gas facilities etc.)

When you are planning to construct a new building, structurally renovate an existing building, or change the use of your property, you will need a development permit.

The Clear Hills County Land Use Bylaw also details development NOT requiring a permit. A few common ones are:

- Any farm use building, shed, dugout (located at least 40.8m/134 feet from the road right-of-way) or minor accessory use that otherwise conforms with the provisions of the Land Use Bylaw.
- Minor repair or maintenance to a building (provided there are no structural changes).
- The erection or repair of a fence that is less than 1 meter (3 feet) in height in front yards and 2 meters (6 feet) in height in rear and side yards.
- Decks (provided they have no walls or roof and are less than .6 meter (2 feet) from the ground level.
- Accessory buildings (sheds etc.) under 9.29m² that do not have a foundation.


In accordance with the Municipal Government Act every municipality must pass a land use bylaw.

The purpose of the bylaw is to outline the rules and regulations for development of land within the Municipality.

Clear Hills County Council is reviewing our current Land Use Bylaw to make it easier to read and find information, in addition also cleaning up duplicate items or items that are not relevant to our county. This review is being completed without changing the original content and information.

If you are planning to construct a building, start a business, change land use (zone), undertake renovations or redevelopment, erect a sign, or establish a secondary suite, the Land Use Bylaw will provide direction on the applicable rules and regulations you'll need to consider.

Screening for colorectal cancer saves lives!

Colorectal cancer is one of the leading causes of cancer deaths in Alberta.


Most cases of colorectal cancer are in people aged 50 and older with no family history. If you're **50 to 74 years old**, it's important to get screened regularly.

Here's why screening is so important:

- With regular screening you can find cancer early, when it's easier to treat. In fact, **90% of cases can be treated successfully** if found early.
- Colorectal cancer often starts as a polyp, a small growth in your colon or rectum. This polyp may be harmless, but over time it could develop into colorectal cancer.
- Screening can also find and remove pre-cancerous polyps and prevent colorectal cancer.

Remember

Colorectal cancer screening is for people who **don't have any symptoms**.



The colon and rectum are also called the large bowel and large intestine.

What is a FIT home stool test?

The Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT) is an easy at-home colorectal cancer screening test. FIT **checks for blood in your stool** (poop) that you can't see. You should plan to do a FIT **every year starting at age 50**.



There are 2 easy ways to get your free FIT!

Choose what works best for you.

- ➔ **Talk to your doctor** about colorectal cancer screening. They'll give you a lab requisition form. Take this form to the lab to pick up your FIT.

OR

- ➔ **Order online** at screeningforlife.ca or call AHS Screening Programs toll-free at 1-866-727-3926. **We'll mail you a FIT.**

You can do your FIT at home using the easy to follow instructions. Take your completed FIT to the lab for testing. Your FIT result will be mailed to you in the next few weeks.

What happens if the FIT result is abnormal?

An abnormal FIT result means blood was found in your stool sample. Although blood in the stool can be from cancer or polyps, it can also be there for other reasons such as hemorrhoids or another condition. If your FIT result is abnormal a colonoscopy may be needed to find the cause.

Are there risks with doing a FIT?

FIT does run the risk of missing blood in the stool, because a polyp or cancer may not bleed at the time you take the test. This is why **screening with FIT every year** gives you the best chance of finding colorectal cancer early when treatment can work better. Tell your doctor if you've symptoms like rectal bleeding, abdominal (belly) pain or a change in your stool pattern, as other testing may be needed.

RE: Closure of medication dispensing service at the Worsley Community Health Centre

Following up on the news we shared with you recently regarding the closure of medication dispensing service at Worsley Community Health Centre, we would like to provide some additional information.

We would like to apologize for providing incorrect information on the regulatory body for Nurse Practitioners in Alberta. Nurse Practitioners fall under the regulatory guidelines of the [College of Registered Nurses of Alberta](#), not the Nurse Practitioners Association of Alberta. Again, we apologize for providing incorrect information in our last correspondence.

As you are aware, Alberta Health Services (AHS) is currently updating our processes regarding the dispensing or filling of prescriptions at the Worsley Community Health Centre to align with regulatory guidelines set by the [College of Registered Nurses of Alberta \(CRNA\)](#) and the [Alberta College of Pharmacy](#).

We understand there was an historical practice of dispensing prescribed medication at the Worsley Community Health Centre and that this will be a significant change for the community.

This change in practice was made with patient safety in mind and to ensure healthcare teams are working within the scope of their roles as set out by their regulatory bodies which fall under the Government of Alberta's [Health Profession Act](#).

Upon review of the medication dispensing service at Worsley Community Health Centre by both CRNA and the Alberta College of Pharmacy, it is clear this service is out of scope for both the Nurse Practitioner and associated pharmacy and that it cannot continue.

We acknowledge that this required change will impact some residents, and we apologize for any confusion or inconvenience this has caused for the community.

The onsite Nurse Practitioner at Worsley Community Health Centre will continue to prescribe medications to patients as required, as that falls within the scope of practice; however, patients are unable to have their prescriptions filled or dispensed at the health centre.

The Nurse Practitioner will be able to provide small amounts of medications in urgent circumstances, but patients will need to visit a registered pharmacy to have their full prescription filled or dispensed.

Over the counter medications will also not be available for purchase at the Worsley Community Health Centre.

We are unaware of any current mobile pharmacy services or delivery services available from nearby pharmacies to the Worsley area. Providing a delivery service to Worsley, or establishing a satellite pharmacy in Worsley, would be entirely up to the private community pharmacies in the local geographic area.

For example, Rainbow Lake, a remote community west of High Level, works with private pharmacies in High Level to provide prescription delivery service for its residents twice a week.

Patient safety is one of our utmost priorities. While we understand the removal of this historical service will have an impact for residents of Worsley, we have a duty to ensure the services being provided fall within the regulated scopes of practice for both the Nurse Practitioner and the local pharmacy.

Do you have livestock?

Are you aware of the VSI (Veterinarian Services Incorporated) Program?

- * Aids in the development of livestock expansion with a long term goal of the producer and veterinarian services sustainability.
- * The VSI program supplies a cost-share support to livestock producers, whereby Clear Hills County covers 50% of the cost eligible veterinary procedures.
- * Membership is \$52.50 for a five year term.

Do you know the County has a BSE Testing Incentive Program?

The BSE testing program is to encourage producers to participate in BST Testing and assist in realizing the target of 30,000 beef cattle annually being tested to keep Canada's status as a controlled BSE risk country.

Eligibility: must be a VSI member and resident/landowner in Clear Hills County with livestock.

Restrictions: Only Veterinarian Clinics (and livestock owners) will have access to the BSE test results.

Process: VSI services provides the County with a list of members that had beef cattle tested in the quarterly report. The County then pays the member. The 20022/2023 incentive is \$125/animal.

Hello Livestock Producers

The North Peace Regional Landfill requests that you not place used twine from your hay and straw bales in the garbage bins at the County Transfer Stations or your own personal bins, as when the loads come into the Regional Landfill the twine can wrap around the drums of the Compactor causing operational issues.

Instead, place the loose twine (plastic only) in recycling bags that can be picked up from the Regional Landfill or the Transfer Station Attendants and return the full bags to the Collection site.

This twine can be recycled into car parts, flower pots, composite decking and dimensional lumber.

Twine Recycling

3 steps to ensure your used twine can be accepted and recycled:

Please contact your local 'Alberta Ag-Plastic. *Recycle It!*' pilot collection site to confirm that it collects grain bags and/or twine, its hours of operation and if assistance is available.



1 Shake

- Remove as much debris, snow or ice as possible*
- Do not include net wrap




2 Bag

- Obtain Cleanfarms recycling bag from your collection site
- Place loose twine in a Cleanfarms recycling bag *Plastic twine only.*
- Poke small holes in bag at the bottom to drain water
- Secure bag tightly closed with twine or zip tie




