





### 1. POLICY STATEMENT

Clear Hills County recognizes the value of continued education and trades training among its citizens and will develop a policy to provide scholarships to Clear Hills County residents to assist with the costs to obtain additional education and training. These scholarships will be known as the Clear Hills County Continuing Education Scholarships.

### 2. **DEFINITIONS**:

2.1.	Qualifying Year	September 1 <sup>st</sup> Current year to August 31 <sup>st</sup> of the next year
2.2.	Education Fees	Tuition, Books, Cost of Living, Transportation, Fees & Charges
2.3.	Eligible Programs	Trades (Technical School), Apprenticeship, Postsecondary Degrees (associate, bachelor's, or graduate), Professional Certification and Product-specific certifications (i.e., Continuing Education Programs & Courses)
2.4.	Enrolled	Has applied and been accepted to an "Eligible Program"
2.5.	Proof of Tuition payment	An official receipt showing proof of Tuition paid to the institute of the eligible program.
2.6.	CES	Continuing Education Scholarship
2.7.	Supplementary Trade year	When the individual can successfully complete 2 consecutive Trade years in the qualifying year.  i.e., 1st year welding and 2nd year welding within September 1st to August 31st.

### 3. **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:**

3.1. An annual budget of \$50,000.00 will be set for continuing education

scholarships, to be distributed based on approved scholarship applications, 50% on the first deadline and 50% on the second deadline until the budget is depleted.

3.2. Each Scholarship will be to cover education fees to a maximum of \$3,000.00.

### 4. GENERAL

- 4.1. To be eligible for a scholarship applicant must
  - Be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant, and resident of Alberta.
  - Be a resident of Clear Hills County or the Village of Hines Creek when applying for the first year.
  - Be actively enrolled or have applied to enroll in an eligible program.
  - Include a short essay as part of the application package, describing what they are doing or have done to make the County or Village of Hines Creek a better place to live, work or relax.
- 4.2. The biannual application deadlines will be October 1st and February 1st.
- 4.3. For Trades Programs ONLY, applicants seeking to apply beyond the October 1st or February 1st deadlines may still be eligible for a scholarship. If they submit their application before or during the enrolment period for the trade program, their application will be evaluated during the next intake deadline. (to a maximum of \$4,500.00 per qualifying year).
- 4.4. When a scholarship recipient will be completing a second consecutive Trade year in the same program within the qualifying year, then the individual will be able to apply for a supplementary CES at a reduced amount of \$1,500.00.
- 4.5. Applicants completing a second consecutive Trade year in the same program within the qualifying year may apply for a retroactive CES during that same qualifying year.
- 4.6. A scholarship recipient will only be able to access one full scholarship and one Supplementary Trade year scholarship within the qualifying year.
- 4.7. Administration will review all applications and distribute the Scholarship funds to qualifying applicants in accordance with Section 3 of this policy.
- 4.8. A report will be made to Council after the distribution of the Scholarships.
- 4.9. If qualifying applications exceed the annual budget administration will present Council with the financial details for their direction prior to distribution of the Scholarship funds.

4.10. Applicants enrolled in multi-year education programs may submit a scholarship application annually, prior to the deadlines. Scholarships will not be approved for previous years eligible programs that have completed at the time of application.

### 4.11. Eligibility:

- 4.11 Eligible Programs: Trades (Technical School), Apprenticeship, Postsecondary Degrees (associate, bachelor's, or graduate), Professional Certification and Product-specific certifications.
- 4.12 Scholarship Payment: will be processed upon the Recipient providing proof that tuition or registration fee has been paid in the form of a receipt with the tuition or registration fee clearly identified, and completion of any necessary documentation or agreements. A debit or credit card slip is not considered proof of payment.
- 4.13 Proof of Completion: Recipients will provide a certificate or verification letter provided by the educating body confirming successful completion of the education the scholarship was received for. Failure to provide proof of completion will require the Recipient to repay the Scholarship in full.
- 4.14 Repayment Recipient will repay the scholarship if they do not complete the Eligible Program the scholarship was received for or fail to provide proof of completion within 8 weeks of completing the program or course.
- 4.15 Recipients that fail to fulfil the reporting requirements to the point in time that a demand for repayment invoice is issued will not be eligible to receive any further Continuing Education Scholarships.
- 4.16 All requirements for past scholarships must be fulfilled before applying for a new Continuing Education Scholarship.

### 5. FORMS AND PROCEDURES

- 5.1. Administration will develop an application form for the Scholarship.
- 5.2. Administration will develop procedures as needed to address advertising, distribution, and evaluation of applications.

#### **BYLAW NO. 285-24**

A BYLAW OF CLEAR HILLS COUNTY IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, FOR THE PREVENTION OF FIRES AND THE PRESERVATION OF LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM INJURY OR DESTRUCTION BY FIRE.

WHEREAS Sections 7 and 8 of the *Municipal Government Act of Alberta, 2000 being Chapter M-26.1* authorizes the County to pass Bylaws that regulate or prohibit the burning of fires for the safety, health and welfare of people and protection of people and property; and

WHEREAS, the Forest and Prairie Protection Act, R.S.A. 2000 Chapter F-19 grants certain additional powers and responsibilities to Clear Hills County and pursuant to Sections 7 and 8 of the *Municipal Government Act*, Council may pass Bylaws for the prevention of prairie or running fires and the enforcement of the provisions of the Forest and Prairie Protection Act in that behalf; and

WHEREAS the Council of Clear Hills County considers it desirable to provide for the prevention, regulation, and control of the lighting of fires within Clear Hills County and for the preservation of life and property from damage or destruction by fire on the terms hereinafter provided:

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of Clear Hills County, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

#### **SECTION 1: DEFINITIONS**

- 1.1 The following definitions will apply to this Bylaw:
  - a. COUNCIL shall mean the Council of Clear Hills County.
  - b. CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER shall mean the Chief Administrative Officer of Clear Hills County, in the Province of Alberta.
  - c. **COUNTY** shall mean Clear Hills County.
  - d. FIRE means a process or state of combustion where a flame may or may not be produced.
  - e. **FIRE BAN** shall mean a provincial ministerial order, or a Fire Ban motion made by Council, to extinguish open fires or other fires deemed to be hazardous in the County.
  - f. BURN shall mean any fires ignited in Clear Hills County.
  - g. FIRE CONTROL ZONE refers to the corresponding numbered Fire Control Zone established in the Fire Control Regulation (Alberta Regulation 29/2005). Fire Control Zone 32 is the Forest Protection Area in Clear Hills County.
  - h. **FOREST PROTECTION AREA** means an area, or the area designated under section 41 (c) of the Forest and Prairie Protection Act.
  - NON-PERMIT AREA means an area of land that is not within the Forest Protection Area and that has been designated as a non-permit area by Ministerial Order.
  - j. **OHV** means off-highway vehicle, and has the same meaning assigned to it in the Traffic Safety Act.
  - k. SAFE WOOD CAMPFIRES are defined as:

- No larger than 0.5 (zero point five) metres high by 0.5 (zero point five) metres wide.
- Within a metal, brick, or rock fire ring.
- Placed on a rock, gravel, sand, or other non-combustible surface that extends at least 1 (one) metre around the fire.
- Having enough fire suppression available to fully extinguish a safe wood campfire.
- Continuously supervised and completely extinguished (soaked with fire suppressant, stirred, and soaked again until cold) before leaving.
- Using extreme caution in windy or gusty conditions.
- 1.2 Campfires on privately owned land include private land campgrounds and private land recreation areas. Municipalities, campgrounds, and parks (Federal and Provincial) may have additional fire safety requirements.

#### **SECTION 2: STATEMENT**

- 2.1 Clear Hills County Chief Administrative Officer or designate will issue a Clear Hills County Fire Ban at such times as the Minister issues a Fire Control Order for Fire Control Zone 32, pursuant to the Forest and Prairie Protection Act, see map in Schedule A.
- 2.2 Clear Hills County Council will authorize the Chief Administrative Officer or designate to issue a Fire Ban in the County when the County environmental conditions are at a high risk of fires running out of control.

#### **SECTION 3: FIRE BANS**

- 3.1 The Clear Hills County Council may prohibit all fires in the County from the East border of County to the West border of the County and from the South border of the County to North Township 890 of the County. See map in Schedule A.1.
- 3.2 A Fire Ban imposed of this Bylaw shall remain in force until such time as the Council provides notice to the public that the Fire Ban is no longer in effect.
- 3.3 A Clear Hills County Fire Ban may:
  - a. REQUIRE all outdoor fires currently burning in the County to be extinguished.
  - b. PROHIBIT the lighting of outdoor fires in the County.
  - REQUIRE all landowners of the County to have extinguished all burning.

#### **SECTION 4: FIRE BAN ORDERS**

- 4.1 By motion of Council when a Fire Ban is in effect Council may direct the Chief Administration Officer to apply any or all of the following when deemed necessary:
  - a. By Motion of Council- Council may **Prohibit** the operation of Off Highway Vehicles (OHV).
  - b. By Motion of Council- Council may **Permit** small, supervised safe wood campfires in designated camping grounds and designated day use area following safe wood Campfire parameters.
  - c. By Motion of Council- Council may **Permit** small, supervised safe wood campfires on privately owned land following Safe wood Campfire parameters (See Definitions)
- 4.2 A Fire Ban Order made pursuant to this section shall be broadcast on all Clear Hills County media outlets.

Fire Ban signage will be posted at all Provincial Highways entering Clear Hills County.

- 1. HWY 64 Bordering MD of Fairview No. 136
- 2. HWY 729 Bordering MD Fairview No. 136
- 3. HWY732 Bordering MD Fairview No. 136
- 4. HWY 735 Bordering MD of Fairview No. 136
- 5. Hwy 685 Bordering MD of Peace No. 135
- 6. HWY 64 Bordering British Columbia
- 7. HWY 717 Bordering British Columbia
- 8. TWP 880 (Silver Creek Road) Bordering the County of Northern Lights
- 4.3 Without limiting Section 4.1, a Fire Ban expressly prohibits the use of each of the following:
  - a. Burn barrels
  - b. Wood fires in the backcountry.
  - c. Wood fires in random camping areas.
  - d. Wood fires in campgrounds.
  - e. Wood fires on residential properties.
  - f. Fires using charcoal briquettes.
  - g. Turkey fryers; and
  - h. Tiki torches
  - i. Fireworks
  - j. Exploding targets
- 4.4 The Fire Bans do not apply to the following:
  - a. Portable propane fire pits, which are CSA approved or UL certified, within campgrounds, backcountry area, random camping areas and on private land.
  - b. Gas or propane stoves and barbeques that are, that are CSA approved or UL certified and are designed for cooking or heating, within campgrounds, backcountry areas, random camping areas and on private land.
  - c. Catalytic or infrared style heaters within campgrounds, backcountry areas, random camping areas and on private land.

#### **SECTION 5: OFFENCES**

- 5.1 Any person who ignites or allows to burn a fire while a Fire Ban is in effect may be found in violation of this Bylaw.
- 5.2 Any person who contravenes a provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty as set out in attached Schedule B as well as additional charges as described in Bylaw No.286-24 Fees for Extinguishing Fires.
- 5.3 Any single contravention of this Bylaw shall be considered as a single offence and shall not limit additional penalties of this Bylaw from being enforced for additional offences.
- Nothing in this Bylaw shall be construed as curtailing or abridging the right of the County to obtain compensation or to maintain an action for loss of or damage to property from or against the person or persons responsible.

#### **SECTION 6: VIOLATION LETTER**

- 6.1 The Chief Administrative Officer or a designate is authorized and empowered to issue a Violation Letter pursuant of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act.
- 6.2 A Violation Letter shall be issued for each single offence of this Bylaw as per Section 4 of this Bylaw.
- Landowners who have burning that has not been extinguished within 1-day of the Fire Ban will be given a 1-day notice by the Chief Administrative Officer or designate to have all burns extinguished. After that 1-day notice if burns are still active, the Chief Administrative Officer or designate will have the existing fires extinguished. Landowners will be liable for all direct and indirect costs incurred by the County in extinguishing that burn on that parcel of land.

#### **SECTION 7: SEVERABILITY**

7.1 Should any section or part of this Bylaw be found to have been improperly enacted, for any reason, then such section or part shall be regarded as severable from the rest of this Bylaw and this Bylaw remaining after such severance shall be effective and enforceable as if the section found to be improperly enacted had not been enacted as part of this Bylaw.

This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of final reading hereof.



Bylaw 285-24 Schedule A Fire Control Zone Map Clear Hills County


Forest Protection Area







- Launching the Active Communities Initiative to support the renewal, expansion, and construction of small to medium-sized public-use sport and recreation facilities across Alberta.
- Releasing Alberta's long-term Tourism Strategy in collaboration with Travel Alberta, setting a bold target to grow tourism revenues to \$25 billion by 2035 and positioning tourism as Alberta's #1 service export.
- Establishing the *All-Season Resorts Act*, creating a new regulator and land classification to support four-season commercial tourism developments, increase investor confidence, and promote Alberta as a globally renowned destination.

These achievements have laid a strong foundation for the work ahead and demonstrate your team's ability to turn vision into action.

Under your leadership as Minister of Tourism and Sport, I expect you to work closely with your Cabinet and Caucus colleagues and the public service through the Committee, Cabinet and legislative processes to deliver on the following commitments to support Albertans, including:

- Continuing development and implementation of Alberta's All-Season Resort Strategy by expanding opportunities for sustainable tourism in Alberta's Rockies with a special focus on the Kananaskis, Crowsnest Pass, David Thompson, and Grande Cache regions.
- Working collaboratively with Treasury Board and Finance to ensure that visitors to Alberta pay a fair amount of tax and fees to ensure Alberta can grow its tourism industry and related infrastructure in a sustainable fashion.
- Continue to work with Travel Alberta to ensure continued strong growth of tourism in Alberta.



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- Ensure the full implementation of the Fairness and Safety in Sport Act using all available legal and constitutional means necessary.
- Complete a provincial bidding policy and legislation (if necessary) to ensure future
  international and national gaming bids using substantial provincial taxpayer dollars are
  subject to transparent public disclosure requirements and cost/benefit analysis and
  include mandatory referenda for affected communities when appropriate.

I direct you to work closely with the public service, including your Deputy Minister and other senior officials in your ministry, to support the priorities outlined in this letter with the highest standard of professionalism, integrity, and creativity.

I also expect you to regularly and proactively reach out to all ministry-related stakeholders in order to take feedback and identify potential solutions on issues of importance to them, including finding ways our government can reduce burdensome and unnecessary red tape and barriers that are hurting their members' ability to grow the economy and improve quality of life for the Albertans they serve.

Together with you and our Caucus and Cabinet colleagues, I look forward to continuing the important work we have started and to get the job done.
